STATE OF TREE PLAQUES IN CASTLE PARK, FRODSHAM

Using numbering as in CWaC Tree Trail leaflet (Oct 2011)

- No. 1 Plaque is OK but needs cleaning.
- No. 2 Beech was blown down, another beech to be selected. Suggest 'The Elephant Beech' near to No. 15. Needs 6''x6'' post. I have the plaque.
- No. 3 OK.
- No. 4 OK, needs cleaning.
- No. 5 OK.
- No. 6 OK.
- No. 7 Plaque missing. Dove tree is in shadow of Pine which should be removed.
- No. 8 OK, needs cleaning.
- No. 9 OK. But this replacement tree is dead. Move post to Tulip Tree near carpark?
- No. 10 OK.
- No. 11 Needs new plaque.
- No. 12 Needs new plaque.
- No. 13 OK, needs cleaning.
- No. 14 Screw missing, needs cleaning.
- No. 15 OK, needs cleaning.
- No. 16 Tibetan Cherry is dead. Area is probable unsuitable for planting most trees too wet.
- No. 17 Needs new plaque.
- No. 18 OK, needs two screws.
- No. 19 OK.
- No. 20 OK, needs cleaning.
- No. 21 Needs new plaque.
- No.22 OK.
- No. 23 OK.

If the dead Tulip Tree and the Tibetan Cherry are removed, I suggest that a Korean Fir (for which permission has been granted) be planted between numbers 10 and 17, and numbered '9', and a sycamore to the south of the carpark be labelled '16'

Materials required

7 plaques:- Dove Tree; Swamp Cypress; Golden Weeping Willow; Lime; Wollemi Pine; (also Korean Fir – to be planted in September 2017), Sycamore (if approved).

2 posts tanalised 1.2m x 6" x 6" with 45 degree top.

Anti-vandal 2cm stainless steel screws. (6 for each new plaque).

Work required

Remove one pine near to No. 7 Dove Tree. Reposition 2 posts, from dead trees. Install further 2 posts. Replace missing screws Clean 7 plaques.
