91	Apologies for Absence	Cllr J Critchley and Mr J Beswick. Cllr L Jones apologies were received late. He had also tendered his resignation from the committee.
92	Declarations of Interest	Cllr V Kirk – Member of Frack Free.
93	Terms of Reference	TC will check the Terms of Reference to see if they need to be amended to allow for additional members of the committee as Cllr V Kirk had asked to join. Any changes will be considered at the next meeting.

95	Matters Arising	53.1 Ship Street Orchard: There has been no progress. TC to contact the contractor and give a 2 week deadline for the planting of the new trees or for them to provide the money for the new trees and FTI will plant them.

97	Marshlands	Cllr Oulton reported that he had been approached again by Network Rail to run training courses for their staff and would like to use Marshlands and other sites for the exercise. It is fully insured and Cllr Oulton will provide TC with a copy of the Risk Assessment. It was agreed that Cllr Oulton would liaise with FM about potential sites and to set up a work plan.
98	Tree Matters	CWAC have replaced the Tulip Tree and Willow Tree at Castle Park. Community Orchards – the new signs acknowledging FTI, Rotary and Round Table involvement have been erected everywhere except Hob Hey Wood.
99	Rights of Way Maintenance	
99.1	CWAC Liaison	Cllr Sutton reported back on a meeting she had with CWAC Officers about better co-operation over footpath maintenance. There is limited funding available for this work across the whole of Cheshire West so CWAC prioritise a few footpaths, which are deemed to be the most popular. Many footpaths are on private land. CWAC have agreed to provide a full list of footpath before the next meeting and suggest we encourage the development of more 'Friends of' type volunteer groups, which should be able to attract other funding. They acknowledge that there are groups of people who already look after footpaths but don't know which ones – it was agreed that FTC would collate this information and feed it into a future meeting. Cllr Ashton will check with Cheshire Wildlife Trust to see if they are responsible for any footpaths and to see if there is any funding available. Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group want information about the types of footpaths especially where cycling is allowed. The Volunteers Part on 16 December will be a good opportunity to promote the 'Friends of Footpaths' Group. Footpath 74 – TC to contact CWAC to check on the ownership of
