Guidelines for Contact with Media

Print Media, TV & Radio

- The Town Clerk is responsible for issuing News Releases, which communicate new strategies, major projects and stories of local interest. The Town Clerk should agree the content of the News Release with the Chair of the Council prior to its issue.
- Requests made under the provisions of Freedom of Information Act 2000 will be dealt with by the Town Clerk, taking full account of relevant prevailing legislation, including provisions of the Data Protection Act 1998.
- Officers will only comment & be identified in order to confirm matters of fact or operational details and will not express a personal opinion on policy issues.
- The Chair (or Chair of Committee or the leader of the Working Group responsible for the operational area) will issue statements on matters of policy. Normally any quotation will be prefaced with the phrase "Cllr [name], Chair of [the Council/name of Committee] said ... " or similar.
- Members of the press & media wishing to contact the Council with an enquiry will contact the Town Clerk in the first instance (see below for contact details). Examples of local media include:

Social Media (see also Social Media Guidance)

- Social media (Facebook, Twitter etc) is a powerful tool and, employed prudently, can help raise the Council's profile and improve communications between the Council & the people it serves.
- 2.2 It is critical that any interaction by Councillors & employees - with each other and/or with the public is consistent with good practice, ie, it should be rooted in the principle of mutual respect and should not bring the Council into disrepute.

Using the FTC Logo

- The Town Council adopted 'The Bee' as its symbol in honour of Rev William Charles Cotton (a former vicar and an authority on bee keeping), using it in its regalia and the blue plagues placed on buildings & structures of historical value. The volant bee logo (top left corner) was adopted in 2011.
- 3.2 The media may reproduce the logo with the Council's prior written permission.

Filming in Frodsham
