

Back to Normal?

Now that there are no longer legal COVID restrictions placed on activities at the Centre we must rely on the good sense of event organisers to limit the spread of any infection while at the Centre.

- There are no longer any one way systems in operation but clients should avoid the creation of crowds gathering in the confines of corridors or other poorly ventilated areas.
- In Centre rooms, especially those with low ceilings, thought should be given to the avoidance of stuffiness or other signs of poor air quality. The Centre has purchased a number of air quality monitors which give a clear indication of when air quality drops to a level which could be of concern.
- Caretakers and other Centre staff will arrange for the heating to be turned on in advance of your attendance. There should be no need to open all the doors and windows at this stage but if the room becomes over-warm or stuffy then an interval may give a good opportunity to refresh the air.
- The Centre will still be cleaned by Centre staff each weekday morning and antiseptic wipes will still be provided for groups to wipe down chairs, tables, equipment etc.
- Anyone suffering from COVID like symptoms should avoid the risk of passing it on to others in their group by staying away until they feel better.
