# Festival of Walks 2022 Feedback Report

A total of 361 people attended the walks, this is an average of 16 per walk. The highest attendance of 37 was at Walk 5: Hob Hey Wood Discovery Trail and the lowest attendance of 6 at Walk 1: Walk and Write – Re-Awaken Your Senses. This number is down on the last recorded total of 656 in 2019, however 31 walks took place in the 2019 festival, whereas only 23 walks took place in the 2022 festival, due to a number of factors such as; the country only just coming out of lockdown and the pandemic at the time of planning the festival.
