I continue to work closely with Frodsham Youth Club and hold monthly outreach sessions at Saltworks Playing Fields. The next session is on Thursday 31st July at 12pm. I also attended on a Monday/Friday night and speak to the young people about what is happening in the area.

Sunday 6th July was Frodsham Festival in the Park. The weather held and the event was very successful. I managed to catch up with a number of residents/members of the public that I hadn't seen for a while. It was a lovely event seeing all of Frodsham come together.

I attended St. Lukes Primary School Summer Fair on Friday 20th June. The weather was great and the fair was well attended by pupils and parents.

On Thursday 5th June I attended the successful Health and Wellbeing Day at Frodsham Medical Centre. The event was extremely well attended and was a good networking event also.

On Thursday 29th May I attended the Kiddicove Day Nursery and spoke to the young children. They tried on police uniform and had a look around my police van.

We held the Frodsham Fire Station Open Day on Sunday 1st June. The day was a great success as ever and allowed local residents an insight in to the workings of the fire station and police base. Frodsham Fire Station is undergoing a massive refit commencing Monday 4th August which is scheduled to run until the end of March next year. During this time I will be based in a Shipping container at the rear of the fire station and access to the site for members of the public is not allowed. I am currently looking as to how best to hold Police Surgeries over the 7 month period.

Our Community Speed Watch Group continues to run on low numbers and we are looking to recruit new volunteers.

I attended the OPAL (Older People Active Living) meeting at Frodsham Methodist Church on Tuesday 22nd July. I spoke about my role in the police and about policing in the community.

As part of our ongoing work to deter people from committing crime in Cheshire, we have invested in forensic property marking kits to identify those responsible for theft. The work we are doing in this area of prevention is branded Operation Shield. Neighbourhood Policing Teams are visiting households and businesses to introduce forensic property marking. They are offering householders and business owners free kits which are made by a UK company called Selectamark Security Systems plc. Their product is called SelectaDNA.

What is SelectaDNA? It is a cutting-edge way of protecting your property from theft. Each bottle within the kit contains a unique DNA code and thousands of tiny microdots that, once applied, identify it as yours.
